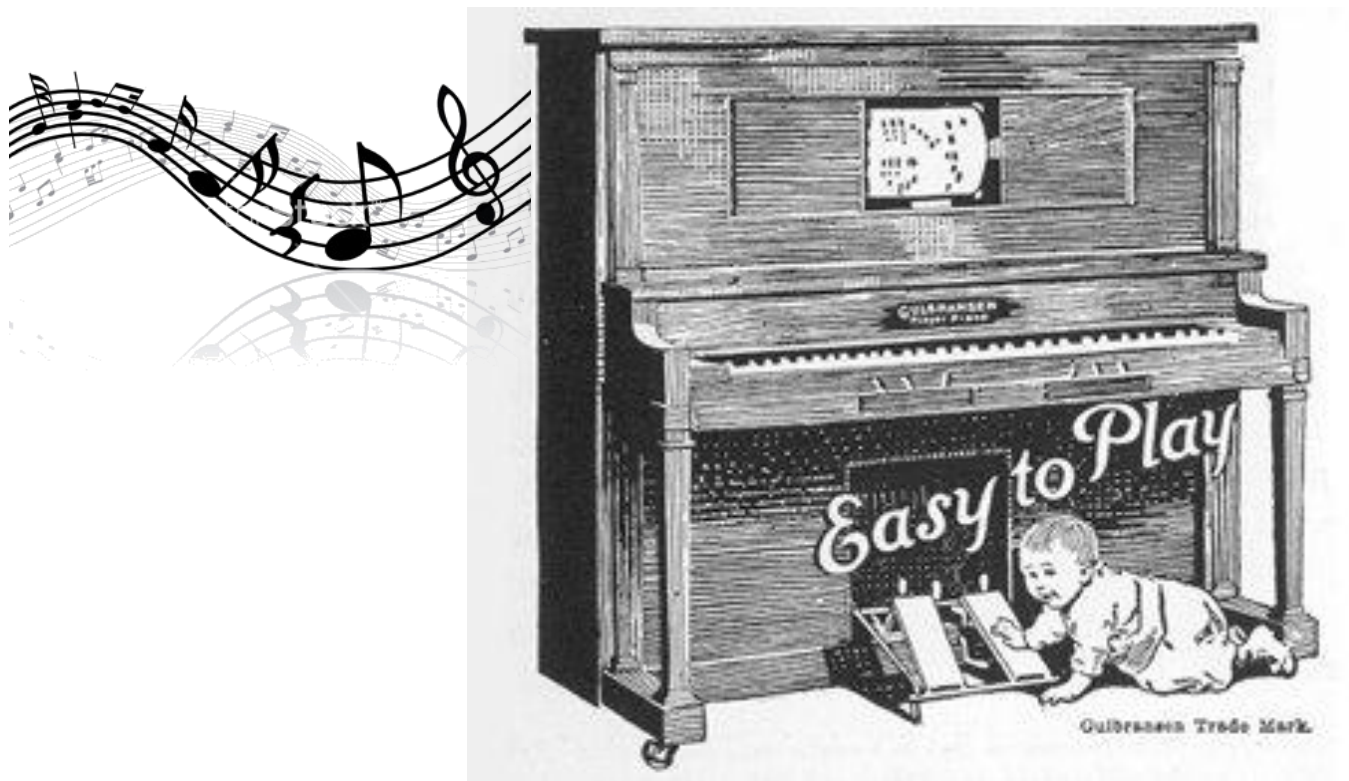

Word Search Words explained

AMPICO (American Piano Company) and **Duo Art** (Aeolian Company) were two excellent examples of a special player **Piano** which could play so well it is said they could “reproduce” the artist. **Music** Boxes played music from a pinned **Cylinder**, punched **Disc** or punched **Cuff** (truncated cone). Music boxes were manufactured or distributed by **Jacot, Kalliope, Mermod Freres, Mira, Otto, Paillard, Polyphon and Regina**.

Wonderful nickelodeons, coin pianos and other instruments were manufactured by **Mills Novelty Company, JP Seeburg** and **Wurlitzer**. Phonographs (record players) were invented by Thomas Edison and manufactured by **Edison**, Victor (**Victrola**) and many others.

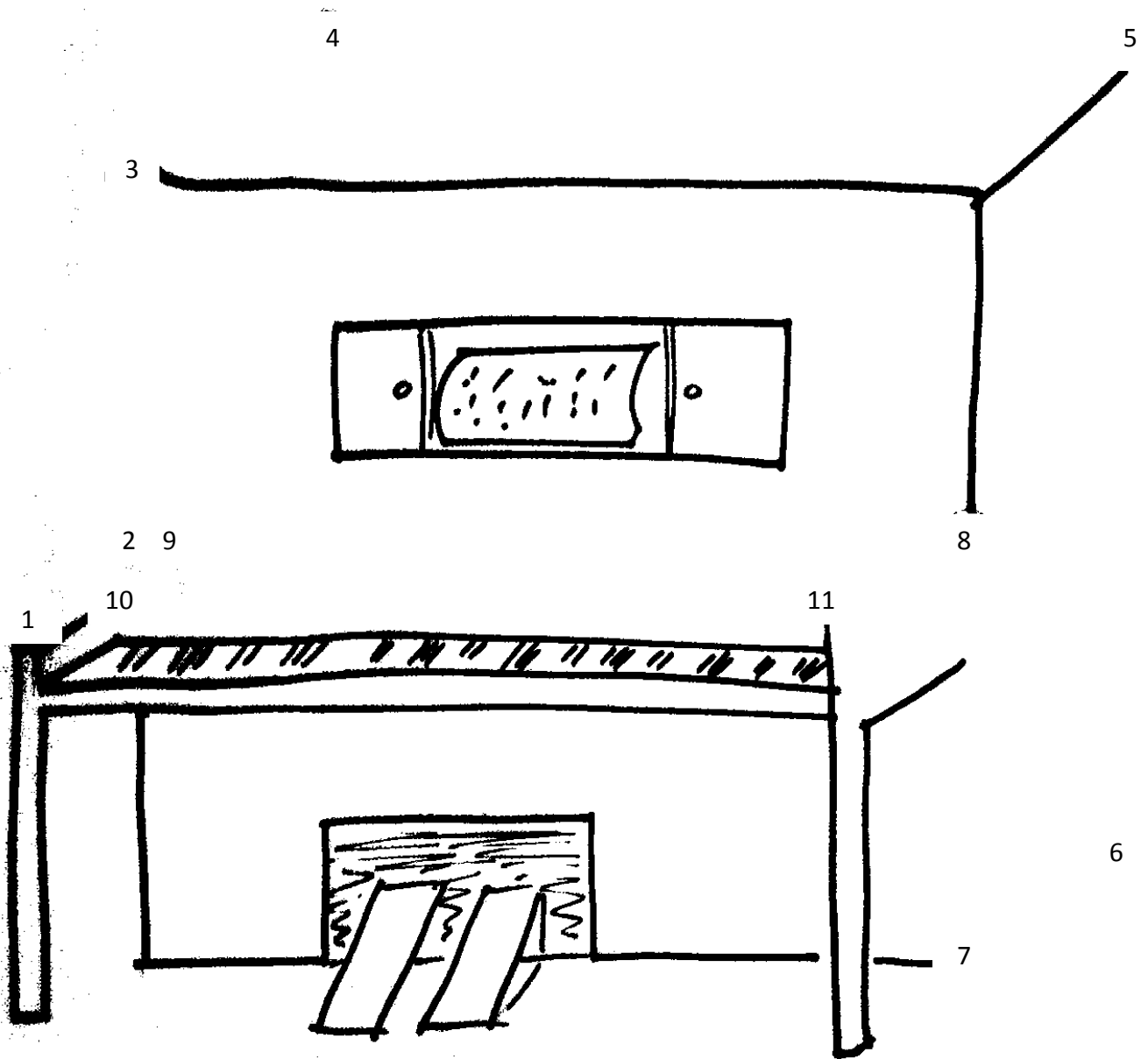

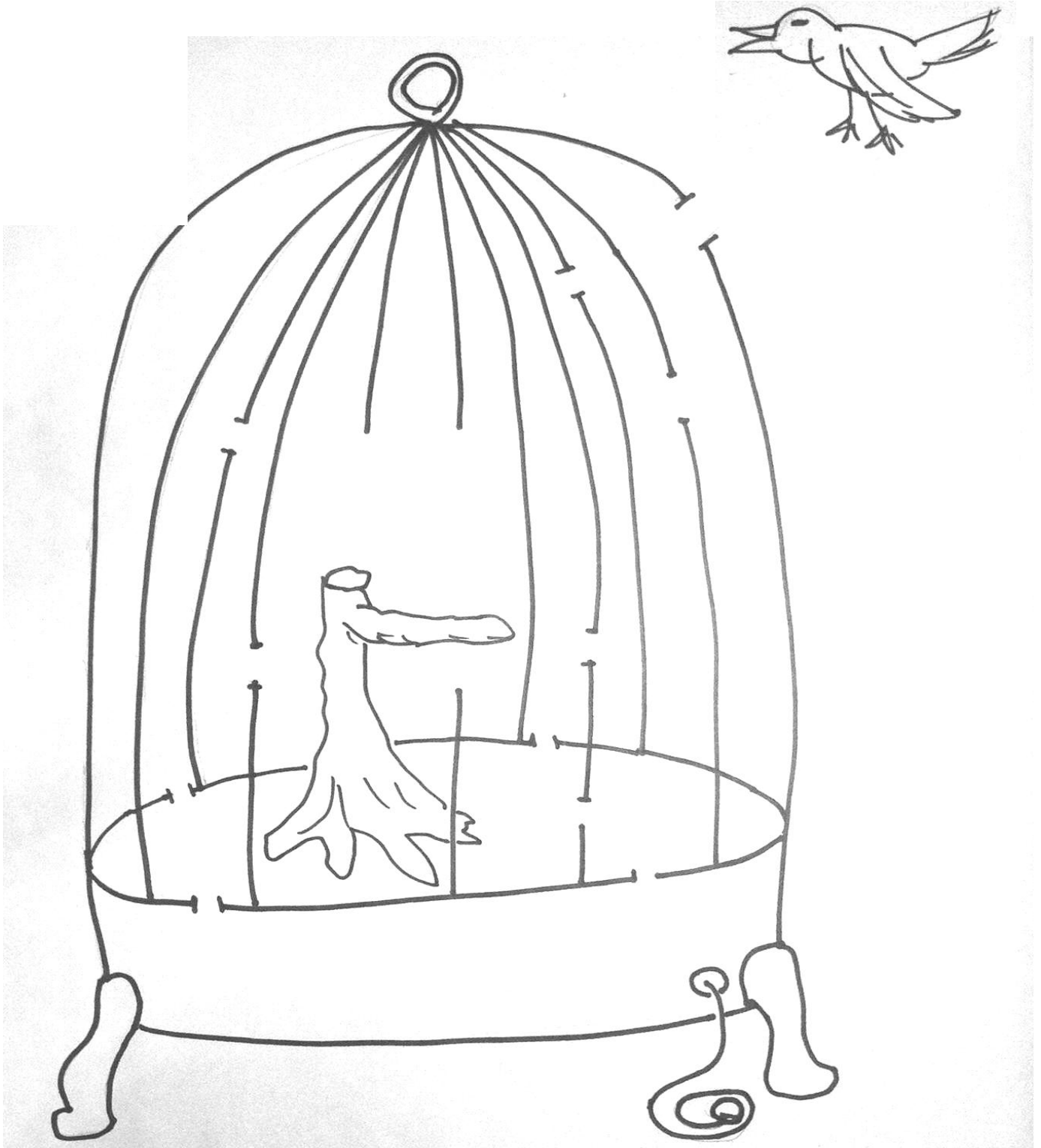

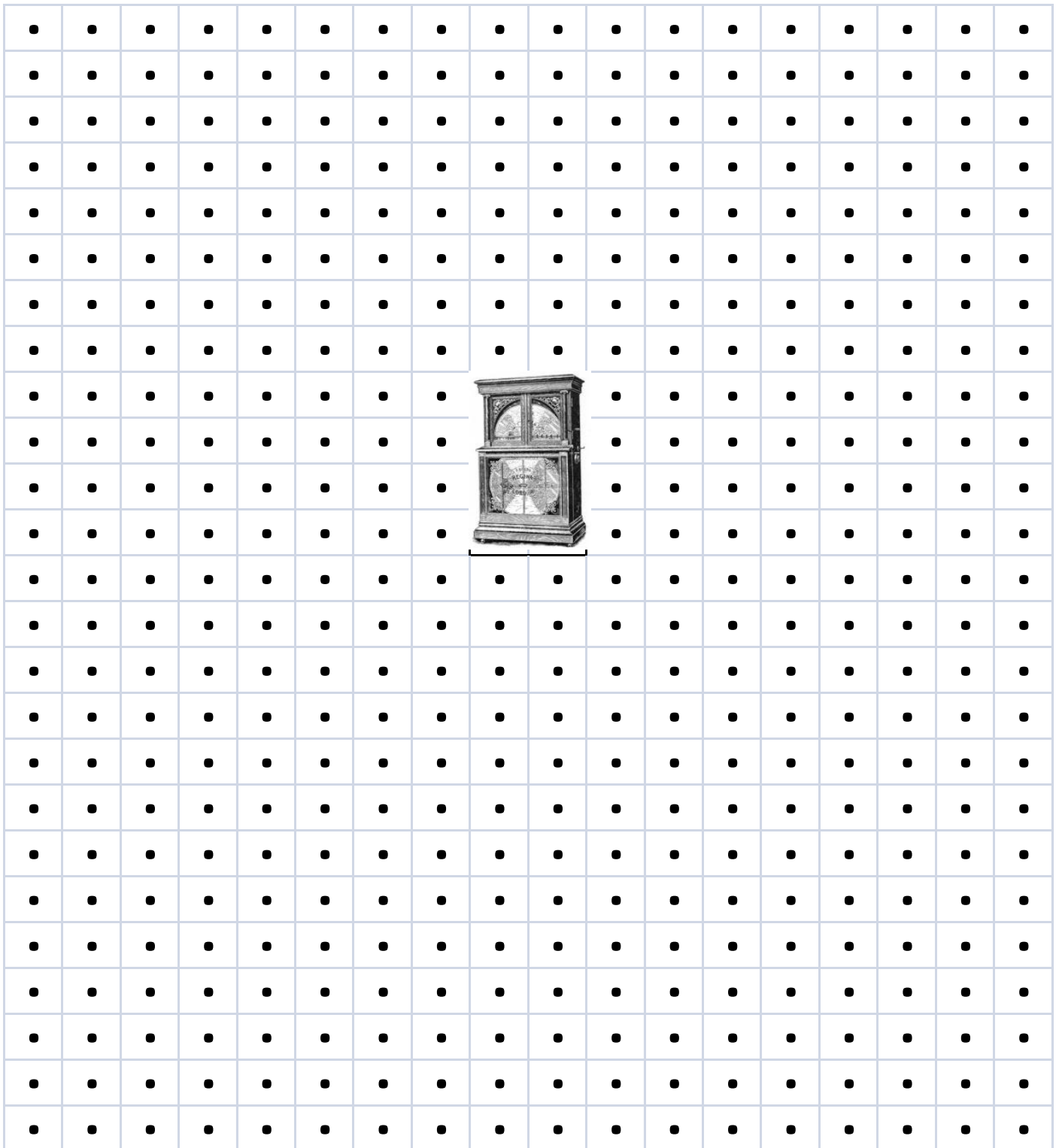

Dots & Boxes Game

HOW TO PLAY: Starting with an empty grid of dots, players take turns, adding a single horizontal or vertical line between two unjoined adjacent dots. A player who completes the fourth side of a 1x1 box earns one point and takes another turn. (The points are typically recorded by placing in the box an identifying mark of the player, such as an initial). The game ends when no more lines can be placed. The winner of the game is the player with the most points



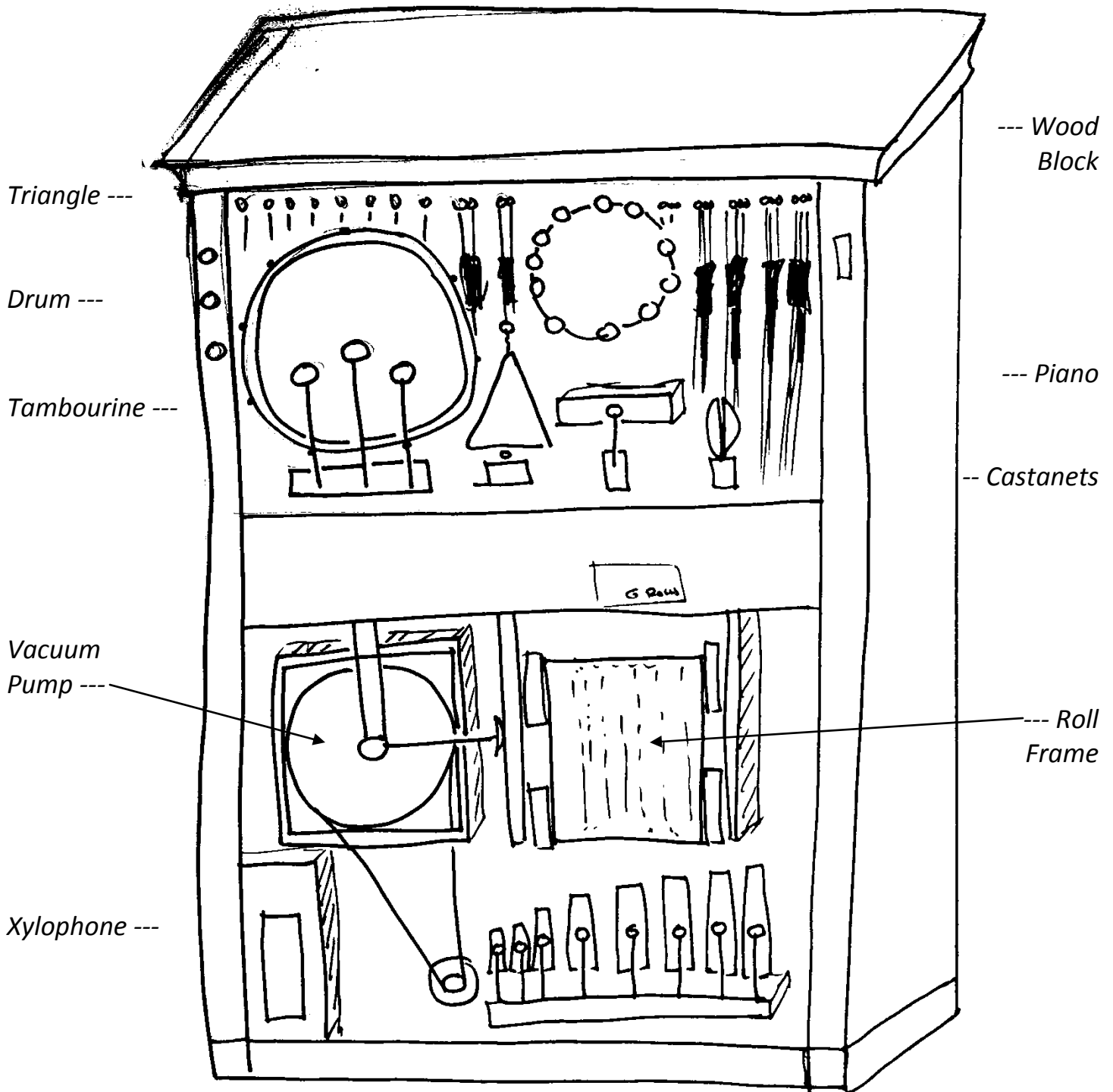

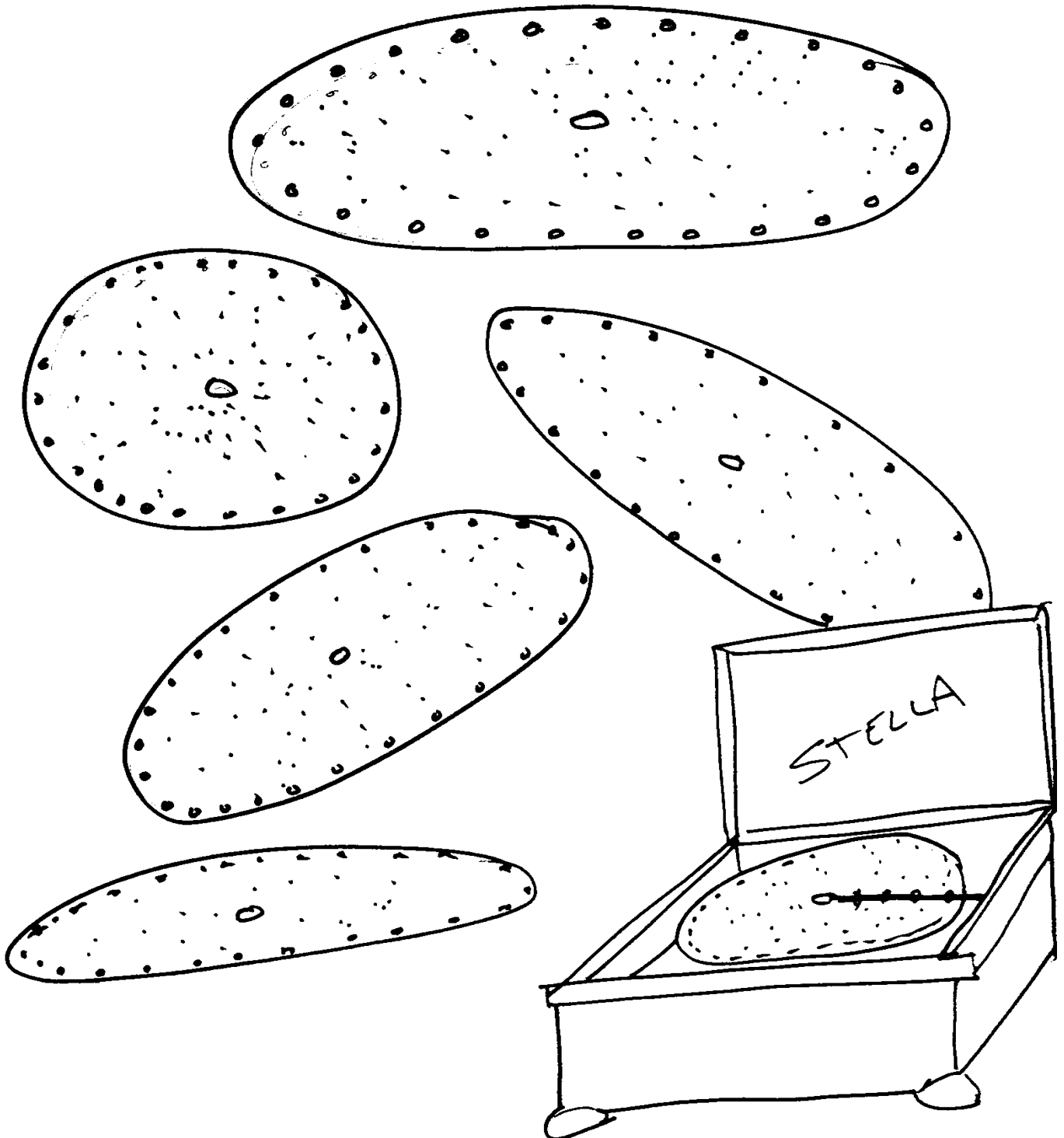

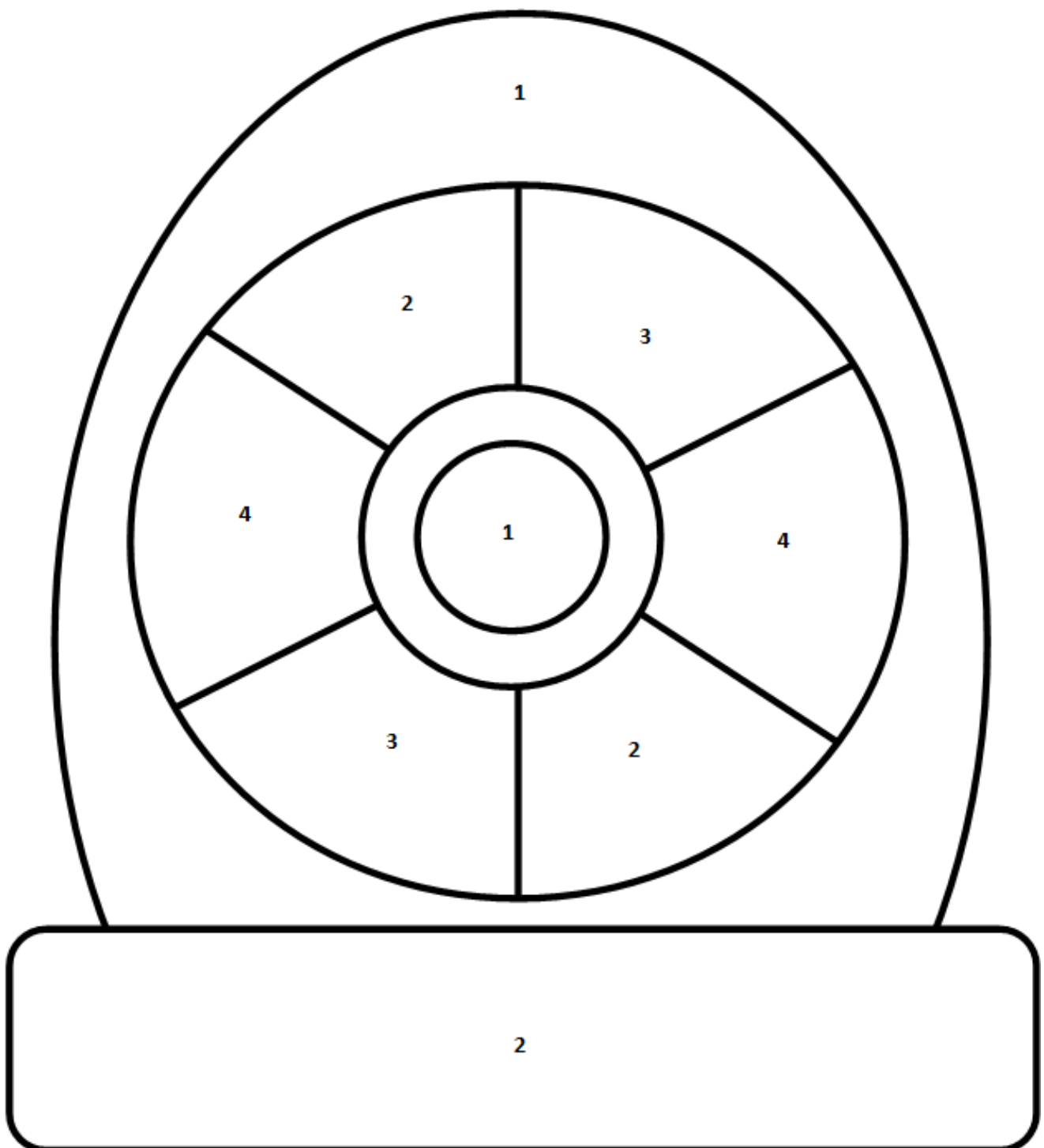

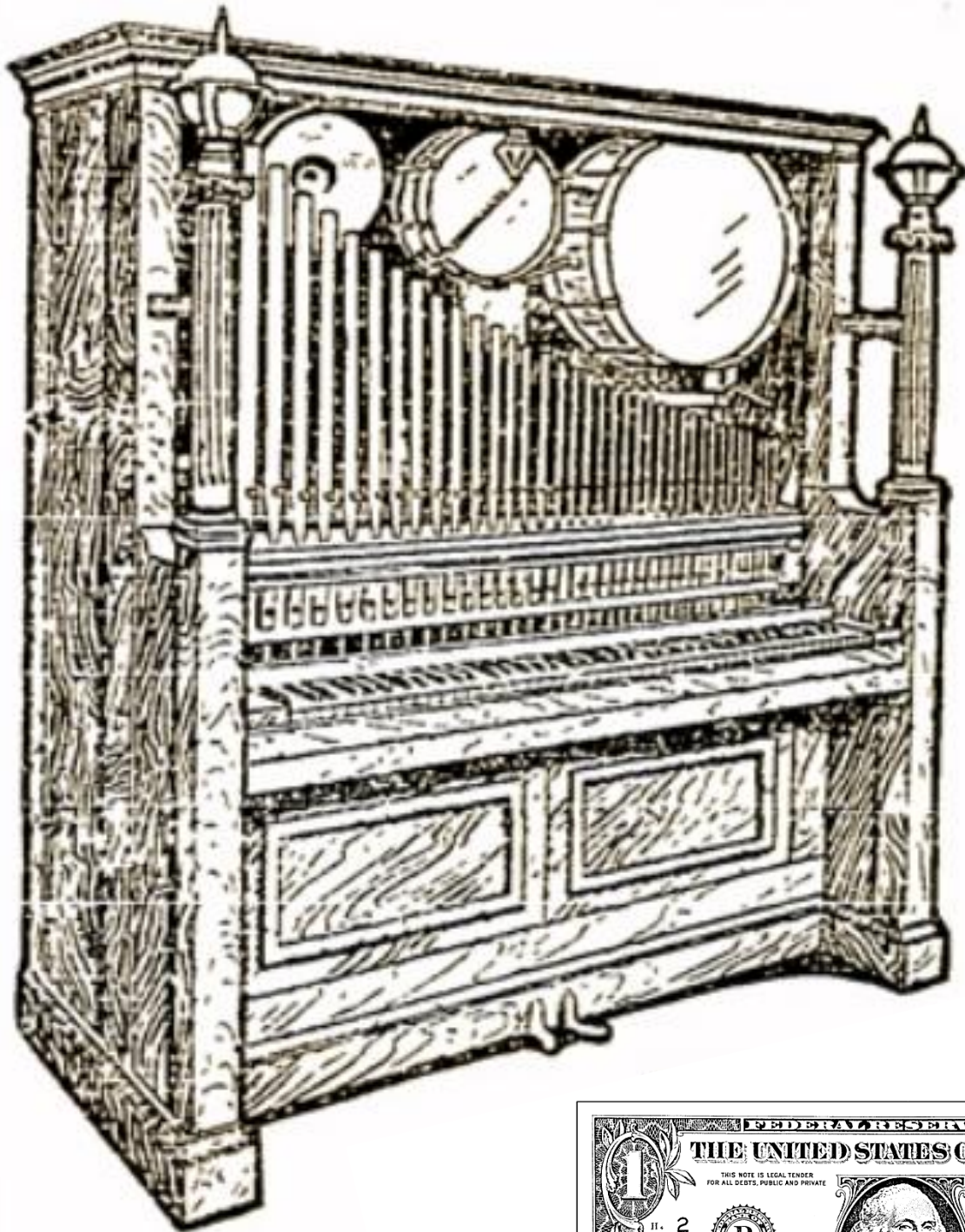

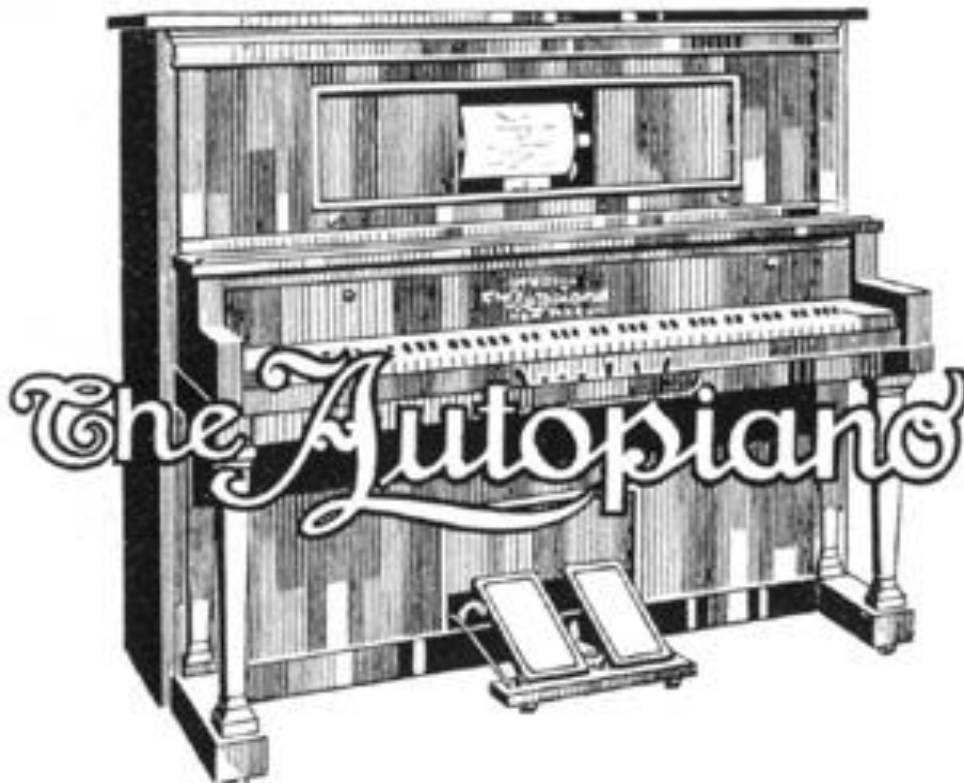
The Karaoke Party

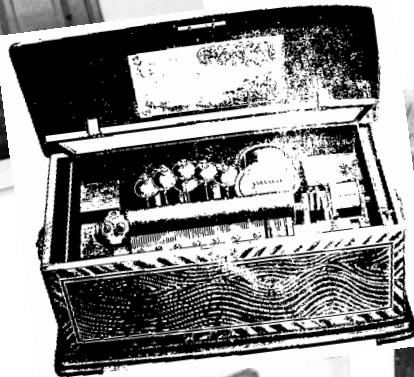
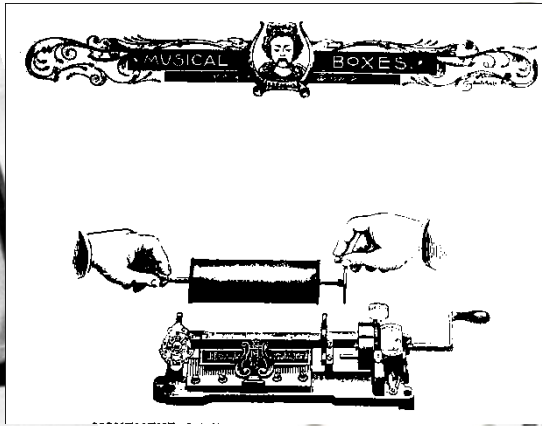
