

AMPICO (American Piano Company) and Duo Art (Aeolian Company) were two excellent examples of a special player Piano which could play so well it is said they could "reproduce" the artist. Music Boxes played music from a pinned Cylinder, punched Disc or punched Cuff (truncated cone). Music boxes were manufactured or distributed by Jacot, Kalliope, Mermod Freres, Mira, Otto, Paillard, Polyphon and Regina.
 Wonderful nickelodeons, coin pianos and other instruments were manufactured by Mills Novelty Company, JP Seeburg and Wurlitzer. Phonographs (record players) were invented by Thomas Edison and manufactured by Edison, Victor (Victrola) and many others.



Dots & Boxes Game

HOW TO PLAY: Starting with an empty grid of dots, players take turns, adding a single horizontal or vertical line between two unjoined adjacent dots. A player who completes the fourth side of a 1×1 box earns one point and takes another turn. (The points are typically recorded by placing in the box an identifying mark of the player, such as an initial). The game ends when no more lines can be placed. The winner of the game is the player with the most points









Wurlitzer Orchestrion with a Wonder Light




